

CREDIT UNION OFFICE TO RETURN TO NEWBRIDGE

Naas Credit Union have confirmed to me that they are seeking a premises to open a Credit Union office in Newbridge following the extension of the Common Bond Area last February and based on the number of new members they have received from the Newbridge area. I have been advised that a significant number of people from the old Newbridge common bond area have engaged with Naas Credit Union and, to date, over 1,100 new members have joined up and are now doing business with them.

Encouraged by these numbers in what is a relatively short period of time, Naas Credit Union now intend to open an office in Newbridge as soon as suitable premises can be located and appropriately fitted out for their needs. This new office will help to optimise the services they can provide to Newbridge members.

This has been a very difficult few years for Newbridge residents and businesses with the loss of the Credit Union. Having worked initially to protect member's savings, my next goal was always to see a return of Credit Union services in the town again. I am confident that this is now in sight and I have offered my full assistance and support to Naas Credit Union Chairman Peter Fullam and his team as they seek suitable premises in Newbridge.

RESULTS OF CURRAGH SURVEY PRESENTED TO MINISTER

MINISTER COMMITS TO CONSULTATIVE FORUM FOR CURRAGH

Thank you to all who completed my recent online survey for users of the Curragh Plains or who took the time to get in touch in relation to it. I have set out some summary results below and **more detail can be found on my website www.martinheydon.com**

I compiled the results and presented my report to Minister for Defence & Agriculture Simon Coveney. The main recommendation from my review of the survey results was the need for more proactive management of the Curragh Plains.

Minister Coveney has now agreed to my proposal to establish a consultative forum of relevant stakeholders chaired by the Department of Defence which will examine the opportunities and challenges that arise and give a platform for those concerns to be addressed. This Forum will also undertake an examination of existing bye-laws under the Curragh of Kildare Act with a view to updating them.

I have met with Department of Defence officials in recent weeks to discuss the Forum and I am hopeful that it will be established by the Autumn.



OVERALL POINTS NOTED FROM SURVEY

- There was a huge sense of pride from Kildare Residents in the natural resource of the Curragh Plains that is synonymous with Kildare;
- Conflicting views exist that while more needs to be done on the Curragh, the natural beauty and qualities that make it what it is, need to be retained and protected;
- More work is required in monitoring the Curragh Plains to protect against the main negative elements of litter, dumping, driving on the plains and illegal encampments;
- There appears to be a lack of detailed knowledge of the rich heritage and history of the Curragh even among local residents. I found a desire for more information;
- Many respondents noted the potential of the Curragh as a tourist destination if walking trails information boards or historic information could be incorporated into the area without disturbing the natural surroundings;
- There appeared to be a lack of detailed knowledge of who has responsibility for management of the Curragh Plains.

FUTURE CURRAGH DEVELOPMENTS

- Expansion of the UN Training Centre into an International Institute for Peace Support and Leadership training at the Curragh is a proposal outlined in the New Defence White Paper, which will be examined by Minister Coveney and Government. The Institute would position Ireland as a global leader in peacekeeping and conflict resolution, building on our experience in this area and on the reputation of the Curragh and the Defence Forces generally.
- Along with the significant **redevelopment of the Curragh Racecourse and gallops**, I believe the time is now right for the establishment of a Forum to focus on the overall Curragh Plains.

FREE GP CARE FOR UNDER 6'S & OVER 70'S

WE'RE TAKING THE FIRST STEPS. GP CARE FOR CHILDREN UNDER 6

With the new GP visit card under 6s you can bring your children to the GP for free consultations and wellness checks.

What services are provided under the GP Visit Card under 6s

GPs will provide general consultations, diagnosis and treatment as well as periodic health assessments focused on health and wellbeing and preventing disease. These checks will be carried out when your child is 2 and 5. It also includes enhanced care for children diagnosed with asthma.

What is an Asthma check?

Each asthma check details the severity of your child or children's asthma and involves a review of medications including making sure your child is using inhalers correctly. Your GP will advise you on how to improve your child's asthma care, including advice on smoke free environment, flu vaccination to prevent influenza and education on what to do if your child's condition is getting worse.

A written plan, tailored to your child, will be given to you to help you manage your child's asthma. Asthma checks have been shown to improve control of asthma in children and reduce hospital attendance.

FREE GP CARE FOR 70'S PLUS

From the 1st August everyone aged 70 and over will be eligible for a GP Visit Card, regardless of income.

This means you can visit your GP and not have to pay for the visit. Over 36,000 people aged 70 or older currently pay to attend a GP as they are not covered by a medical card or a GP Visit Card.

To get a GP Visit Card aged 70 or over, fill in the

application form at your GP, Pharmacy, or download it from www.gpvisitcard.ie

The GP Visit Card is funded by the Government and administered by the HSE.
